

# "SCOTT QUARANTA" The Biggest Radio Receiver Set Ever Made

The "E. H. Scott 48-tube QUARANTA" certainly has to be the most elaborate and biggest radio ensemble ever designed and built. It was manufactured by Scott Radio Laboratories in the 1930's with one such set likely sold to a customer in France in 1936 - the tuner section came into the possession of Mr. Jacques Dubois and represents the cornerstone of this professionally rebuilt Quaranta which he undertook from 1987 until 2000. As written in the last year as part of his compiled notes titled "Service Notes - Scott Full Range Quaranta High Fidelity - 48 Tubes - Superhetero-dyne Receiver", here is Mr. Dubois' account of this project.

November 1620 Schlacht am Weißen Berg), doch schon 2005 auf der Kurzwelle 3333 kHz, die auch 2014 eingesetzt wurde. Sowohl 2012 als auch 2013 bestätigten die QSLs die letztmalige Ausstrahlung. Nachdem 2015 das zehnjährige Jubiläum auf der Kurzwelle ist, gibt es womöglich auch in diesem Jahr etwas zu suchen.





#### **FUNKWETTER - Was erwartet uns in 2025?**



Die große Frage zum Jahreswechsel: Haben wir das Sonnenfleckenmaximum des solaren Zyklus 25 schon hinter uns? Möglicherweise hat es bereits stattgefunden, irgendwann zwischen Juli und November, denn seit dem Spätsommer zeigt die Sonnenaktivität eine Tendenz nach unten. In den letzten Tagen ging es mit dem solaren Flux allerdings wieder deutlich nach oben, viele M-Flares hievten den Flux auf über 250 Einheiten.

Wenn wir uns den Verlauf mehrerer Zyklen ansehen, erkennen wir, dass einige sehr aktive Endphasen haben. Viele der Zyklen weisen Doppelspitzen auf. Mit ein wenig Optimismus sollten wir davon ausgehen, dass auch im Zyklus 25 ein doppelter Spitzenwert auftritt und die Sonnenaktivität sich aktuell in dem kleinen Tal zwischen zwei Aktivitätsspitzen befindet. Das hieße, dass der Zyklus 25 noch nicht zu Ende und noch einmal in 2025 ansteigt.

Die kritischen F2-Frequenzen in den mittleren Breiten liegen aufgrund der sog. Winteranomalie im Moment recht hoch. Und da die Anomalien auf der Nord- und Südhalbkugel sich um sechs Monate unterscheiden, sollte die Aktivitätsspitze in diese Zeit fallen.

Es besteht also berechtigte Hoffnung auf ein frohes, neues DX-trächtiges Jahr. Und das wünsche ich allen Kurzwellenfreunden für 2025! Sowie einen stets störungsfreien Empfang!

#### ----- Google translation:

The big question at the turn of the year: Have we already passed the sunspot maximum of solar cycle 25? It may have already happened, sometime between July and November, because solar activity has been trending downward since late summer. In the last few days, however, the solar flux has risen significantly again, with many M-flares pushing the flux up to over 250 units.

If we look at the course of several cycles, we can see that some have very active end phases. Many of the cycles have double peaks. With a little optimism, we should assume that cycle 25 will also have a double peak and that solar activity is currently in the small valley between two activity peaks. This would mean that cycle 25 is not over yet and will increase again in 2025.

The critical F2 frequencies in the middle latitudes are currently quite high due to the so-called winter anomaly. And since the anomalies in the northern and southern hemispheres differ by six months, the peak of activity should fall during this time.

So there is legitimate hope for a happy, DX-rich new year. And that is what I wish all shortwave friends for 2025! As well as interference-free reception at all times!

ent RX loops, single wire beverages and also remote preamplifier boxes with power over coax placed in feed point of RX antenna.

This project has started in 2016 and used Remote manual IP SWITCH from RemoteQTH.com. After 5 years we upgraded IP Switching to Web-based one with much more features. Web-based relay box with Raspberry Pi 4 allows to control unlimited numbers of IP switches with customize lables, groups profiles. Switching can be done by web, mobile app or hardware switch keypad.

We designed web-based remote controlled 9 RX antenna switch with common-mode filters, preamplifiers and build-in bias tee. There is the possibility of use time scheduled switching for easy operation.


### DX nostalgia by RFK

The Times They Are A-Changin'.... Once upon a time DXing was about receiving foreign radio signals at your home by means of a radio. We didn't have the Internet way back then. Long distance reception at our own shack was the basic idea. "D" for distance and "X" for the unknown. I think many of us remember the joy when we succeeded to hear some rare DX and finally got the confirmation in form of physical QSL cards, letters and much else by 'snail mail'. But what about today?


I have seen that people are reporting loggings they have made over Kiwi SDR receivers located in other parts of the world. Sure, that can be useful if you want to check out if a station is on the air and what it sounds like. But do these people also send reception reports of what they hear? If they do, do they mention that they really didn't hear the station at home but over a Kiwi receiver located elsewhere, maybe close to the transmitter site? In the old days (if we had had the possibilities) this would have been considered as cheating. Do "loggings" like this really belong in the loggings section? Shouldn't they rather be posted as information and not loggings? Nowadays the basic rule seems to be that everything goes. Everybody do as they please. Well then, why bother about Kiwi receivers when you can easily tune in to web radio stations from all over the world? Then you will also get crystal clear reception and may enjoy music and other programming that you would normally not hear. There are many exciting stations to be discovered here.

Over the years I have been involved in several temporary broadcasts on SW and MW. Naturally we were most interested in hearing how our signal was received in other countries, how far we were reaching out. For each reception report from a distant country we experienced a feeling of satisfaction. It was a proof that our endeavours had paid off. But many also sent reception reports after having listened to a public SDR receiver in Europe, generally the one at the University of Twente in Enschede, Holland. So, while a reception report may arrive from Malaysia or Australia it just proved we could be heard in Holland! Well, we already knew that.... But as the listener had taken the trouble of writing to us, we QSLed anyway. Obviously this was a form of collecting QSL cards but I could never understand why. To me, QSL means 'verification of reception' and these people had never actually heard our broadcasts by the receivers at home. But there were also those who did hear us from their radio shacks and could prove it. These "real" reception reports were highly cherished by us broadcasters. This was real DX!



Now let's get over to the nostalgia section and then we are talking real QSLs, printed items received by letter. These will be left after all of your hard drives containing eQSLs have given up their breath. Old real QSL cards are worth preserving, to remind us about DXing's golden past. Like this one which Bengt Dalhammar BD received in 1965. The card shows the Duladeo Temple (Devanagri) and verifies the reception of AIR Port Blair, Andaman Islands on 4760 kHz.




